TFD Band & TFD Color Guard



The TFD Band was formed in 1949 as the first music band in the history of Japanese fire service. The Band played at the opening of the Tokyo Olympics in 1964, and has so far delivered its performances at national functions, Tokyo Metropolitan Government events, and community assemblies. The TFD Color Guard started off in 1986 with TFD female workers as its members. Their performances with eye-catching flags attract audiences, telling them how important fire prevention and disaster preparedness are. Through the music performances given 300 times or over each year, the TFD calls on people to enhance fire and life safety and directs its efforts toward the realization of *Safe City Tokyo*.



Boys & Girls Fire Club (BFC)

The members, ranging from elementary school pupils to senior high school students, learn about the fire service, gain safety knowledge/skills, appeal to people to watch out for fire, clean their community, and so on.

The TFD has 80 Clubs (about 4,500 members) in its service area.
